

### **Corrective feedback: Recast**

Without directly indicating that the learner's utterance was incorrect, the teacher implicitly reformulates the learner's error, or provides the correction

.

### **Example**

S: Three months ago, I go to the movie theater to watch this movie.

T: Oh, really? You went to watch this movie three months ago?

S: Yes. I went to AMC.

T: What was this movie about?

S: It was a romantic comedy and the end is very touching.

T: Oh! Did you like the ending?

S: Yes, I do! I almost cried.

T: Yeah you did! What happened in the movie?

S: The female character here come to the airport and then she meet the male character. He was a thief, a bad guy.

T: Tell me more about how they met.

S: They met in an airplane and she was sick because of...this...vomiting...

### **Glossary**

**Uptake:** A term to describe learners' responses to corrective feedback. This may contribute to second language acquisition by facilitating noticing and pushing learners to produce more accurate linguistic forms.
